



to serve LGBTQ youth and young adults ages 11-24. We enhance their lives by providing empowering social and service programs that promote self-expression, self-acceptance, leadership development and healthy life choices.

OUTDOORS!

Camp OUTdoors is the largest LGBTQ camp of its kind in the U.S. dedicated to helping LGBTQ youth ages 11- 24 develop leadership skills, work in collaborative ways, and build a strong sense of self and community. We receive over 450 applicants and can serve 150 youth per session. 2018 Marked our 11th year!

service programs

P.O.N.D. Housing

With 40% of homeless youth Identifying as LGBTQ, P.O.N.D. not only provides a much-needed safe space for these youth, but also onsite case management, resources, and support. Our 1–2-year transitional living program encourages youth confidence and self-reliance.

Y.E.S. Program

Dedicated to supporting youth as they transition into adulthood and independence. Y.E.S. offers connection to an adult mentor and workshops that teach life skills, interpersonal skills, and professional development.



Queer Blended Learning Center (QBLC)

In partnership with K12, the QBLC ensures all students have a safe and bully-free zone where they can learn, thrive, and succeed.

Youth Centers

Our Youth Center and its satellite locations allow our youth a space to engage in activities that enhance their competence, connections, character, confidence, and contributions to society.




